



Fort Leonard Wood had a wayfinding problem, no one could find their room destination without walking through all the wings of the building. The Facility Manager decided it was time to replace their old Signage with something more effective and up-to-date. The project was put out to bid with very limited criteria. Appenx won the bid with a complete Modular Signage package designed around this criteria that included:

- directory signs
- ceiling grid mounted signs
- department signs, flag mounted above the doors
- ADA compliant restroom signs
- evacuation map holders
- office signs to display 2 to 6 names

All the various sign types have a wood laminate facing. The directory and office signs included windows for paper inserts that could be printed on site using templates supplied by Appenx. These templates included wood simulated backgrounds, like the laminate facings, for the programmable messages. The ceiling signs and the evacuation map holders have magnetic windows for easy message maintenance.

The Appenx Modular Signs (and some non-modular) provide a visual road-map, through the wings of the building, for anyone entering the facility. *The Facility Manager and the Staff were delighted to have their wayfinding problem solved with signage that's so functional and stylish.*
